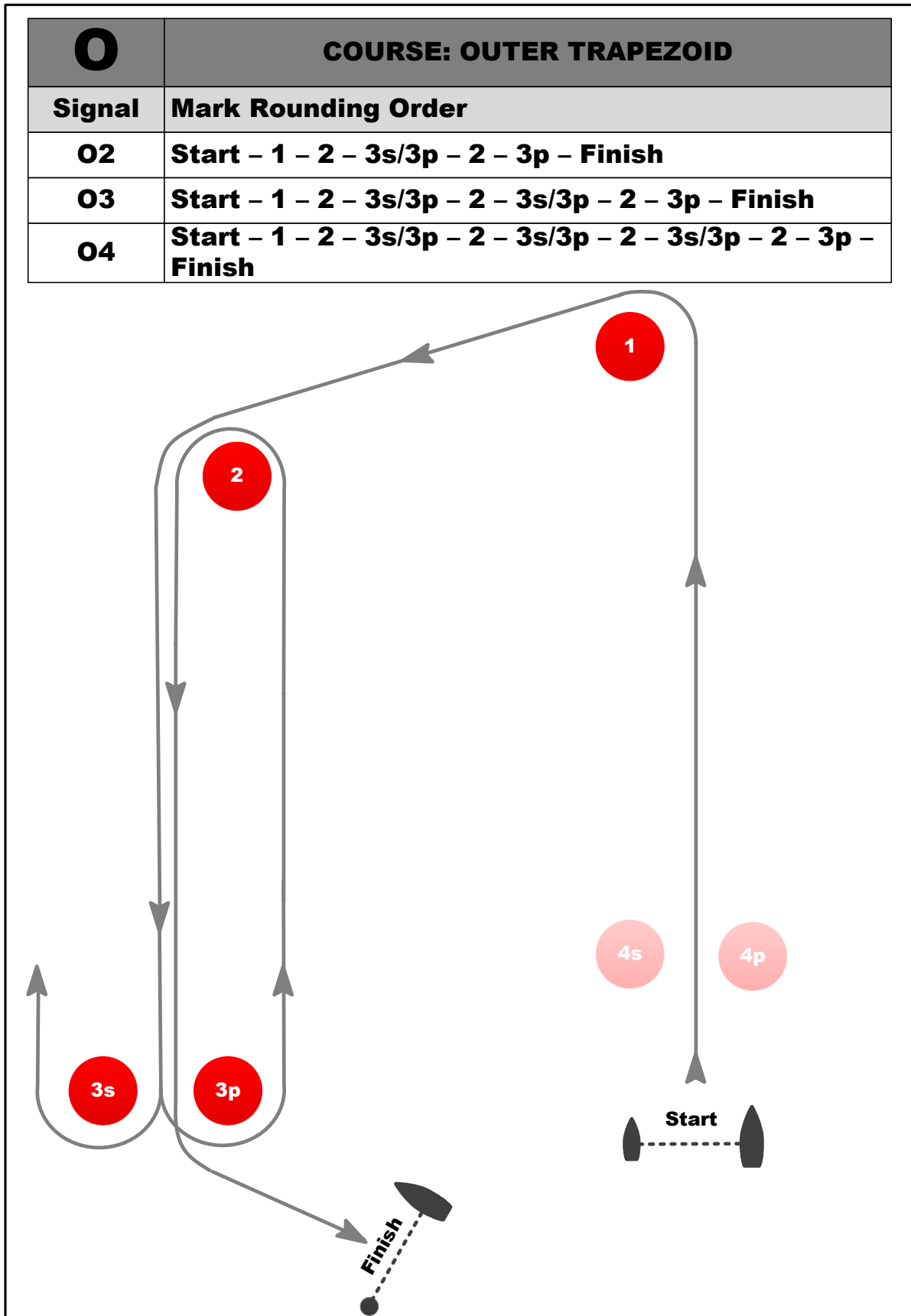

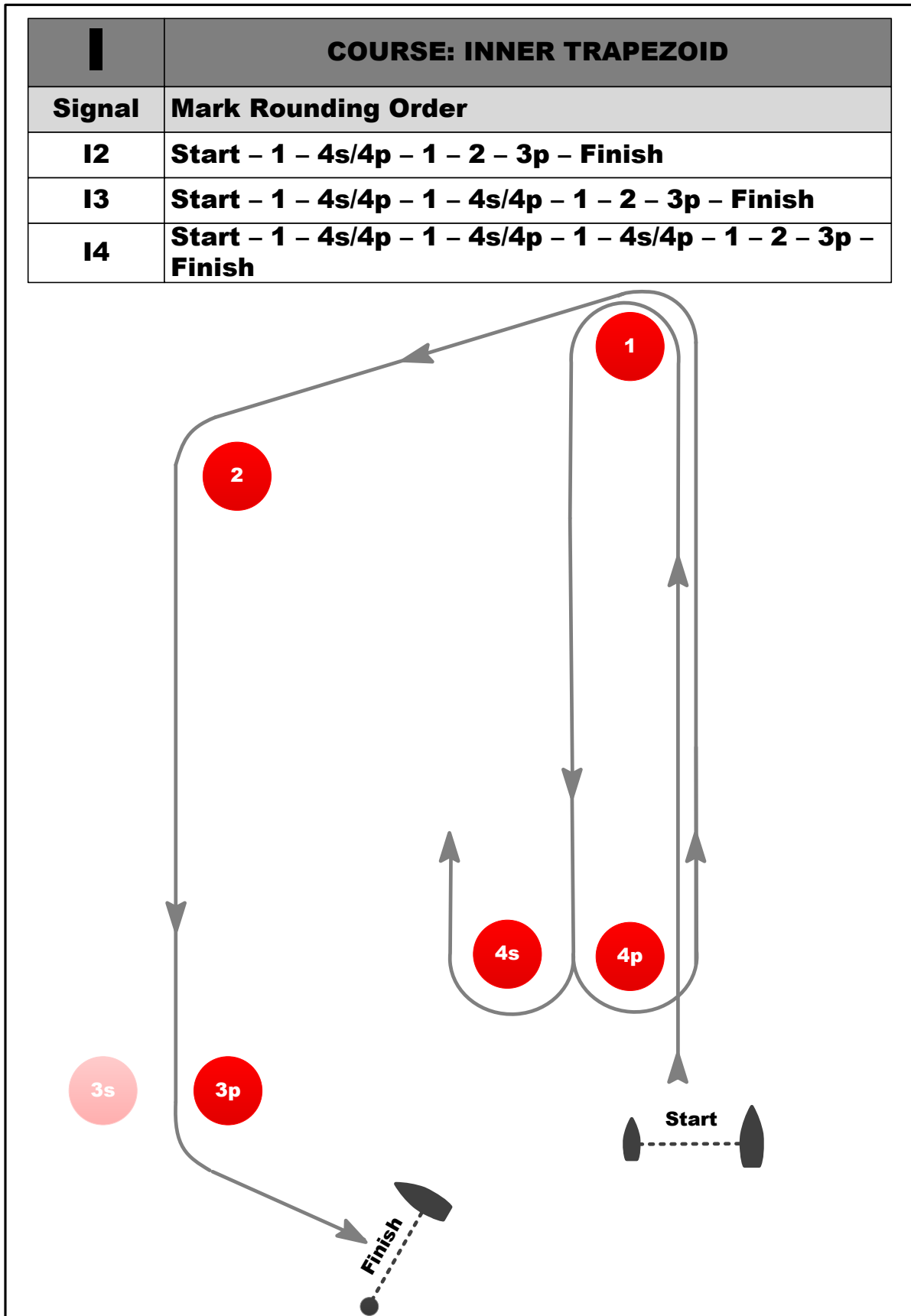
Traditional Courses

LR	COURSE: WINDWARD / LEEWARD with reaching finish
Signal	Mark Rounding Order
LR2	Start – 1 – 4s/4p – 1 – 4p – Finish
LR3	Start – 1 – 4s/4p – 1 – 4s/4p – 1 – 4p – Finish
LR4	Start – 1 – 4s/4p – 1 – 4s/4p – 1 – 4s/4p – 1 – 4p – Finish

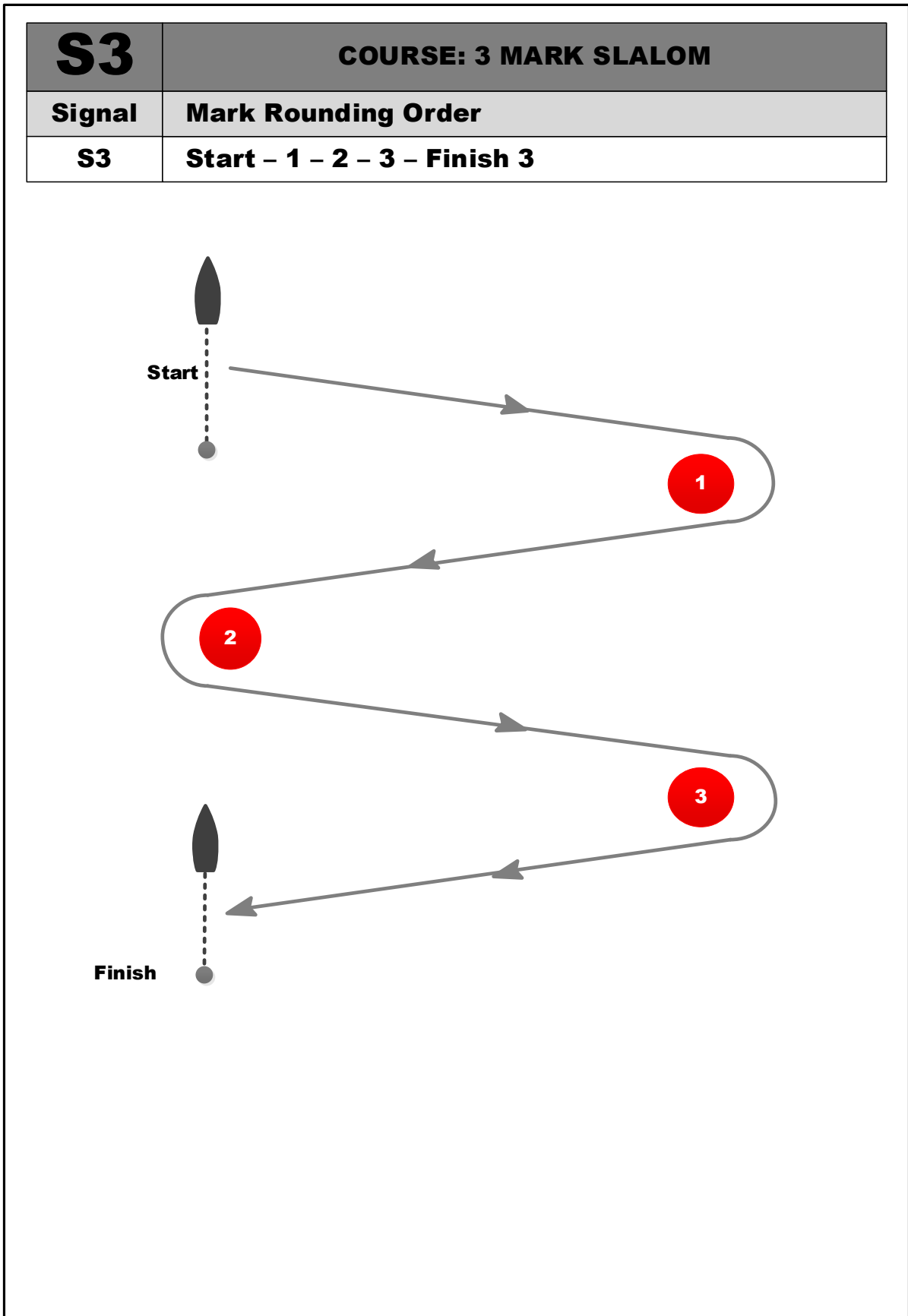
